Such fortune-enviable in its own right, because music is a type of mystery for the initiated prepared for the collective purifying experience of beauty. It has no relevance to the size or prestige of the concert hall, the size of the fee, neither with age, nor the curriculum of the performer. An artist's only desire and fate is art and only exceptional circumstances may change this. Let us commence another music celebration because Warsaw is hosting a newly emerging group of young people who have chosen music as their goal. All of them have already won because they are following a path where human genius is found - Haydn, Beethoven, Boccherini and Lutosławski - and live with them daily. We the listeners remain in hope that with their artistic skills and talents they will find the key to the door of an ideal world of art and once opened will show the way and let them follow.
